Founded in August 2022, as one of 11 statewide regional advisory councils, the Macomb Health Equity Council coordinates activities that promote health equity, particularly for racial and ethnic communities for whom health disparities have been magnified by the COVID-19 pandemic.

MHEC is funded by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Office of Equity and Minority Health (OEMH) in partnership with the Michigan Public Health Institute (MPHI). The Judson Center serves as the backbone organization to support MHEC's formation and implementation of its community-driven goals.
